"Buried Secrets" is set in the period between 1977 and 1992, before the days of social media and when the funeral industry was very different from today.

The author, Harry Pope, began his career as a chauffeur and bearer and, through the course of his career, has worked in repatriation, progressing to an area manager and is today a funeral celebrant.

Harry's memoir shares lots of comical moments and unusual incidents that funeral directors, particularly those working in the profession in Harry's era, will relate to.

As well as these hilarious anecdotes, Harry introduces us to the hidden, and often tragic, world of the funeral arranger, with a look at his involvement in disasters such as the Piper Alpha oil rig and the Lockerbie bombing.
